Objectives & Participation

Objectives

To assist in the development of a new Community Strategic Plan, Micromex Research, together with Hornsby Shire Council, provided various community engagement opportunities to understand:

- Community perceptions of the quality of life within Hornsby Shire, and the variables that impact this
- · Levels of agreement with CSP statements
- Views on living in the Hornsby Shire area and the vision that residents have of the LGA for the future

Level of Response

A total of 2,070 residents participated in the engagement:

- 18 residents provided video feedback to voice their inputs
- 605 residents participated in the telephone survey, 511 respondents were selected by means of a computer based random selection process using the electronic white pages. The remaining 94 respondents were 'number harvested' via face-to-face intercept at a number of areas around the Hornsby Shire LGA.
- 1,447 residents chose to participate through an online survey, which was made available on Council's website.



Objectives & Participation

Community Strategic Plan (CSP)

Hornsby Shire Council is redeveloping its CSP. Council has conducted a range of community engagement activities to identify priorities and aspirations for the area over the next 10 years.

This community engagement program will also assist Council to scope out a 3 year delivery program.

Community engagement is an essential part of the development of the CSP, therefore various methods of engagement were used.

Engagement Activities Conducted:



2,070 residents participated in this research

Summary

What's Good:

- Majority of residents rated their quality of life as 'good' to 'excellent
- 'My Environment' pillar had the highest agreement ratings
- Residents largely value the natural environment
- Residents feel a sense of safety during the day in the Hornsby Shire area

To Be Addressed:

• 'My Property' pillar had the lowest agreement levels overall

 Residents expressed concerns regarding infrastructure, roads and development – particularly that new developments are increasing pressure on already struggling infrastructure

Themes Identified by Respondents

Concern for the environment

Elements of the natural environment appeared numerous times throughout this report, with the natural environment being identified as the most loved aspect of the Hornsby Shire area and an influencer on quality of life.


Residents also expressed concerns with protecting the natural environment with making the Shire a better place and how will it be in 10 years' time – particularly balancing the natural environment with development

Concern for infrastructure and development

Development is another major theme drawn from residents responses with limiting future developments and improving long term planning, with the natural environment in mind.

All of the bottom 5 agreement statements involved infrastructure, planning and development, indicating concerns for adequate infrastructure to cater for the growing population and proposed development plans


Development:

Online Responses	N=1,447
Natural environment – protection of the environment/bush/green spaces, improved local parks and recreational areas	35%
Development – limit new developments, low density area, improved long-term planning, balance between environment and development	34%
Roads – less traffic/congestion, better maintained and improved roads, more/better parking	23%
Increase quantity and quality of services and facilities - schools, recreation centres, general services etc.	22%


The top 2 areas identified were how residents would like the to do more to protect it's natural environment and mitigate against the challenges of development
