

## **Community Banners**

The Hornsby Development Control Plan permits without consent the display of short term temporary community banners to attract public support for religious, cultural, political, social and recreational events. The requirements for exempt community advertising are as follows:

- a) The banner is a temporary advertisement for a religious, cultural, political, social or recreational event only.
- b) Maximum area of 4m<sup>2</sup>.
- c) Sponsorship information is a maximum of 20% of the total area of the banner displayed at the venue or the sponsor's premises.
- d) The banner is erected a maximum of 28 days before the event.
- e) The banner is removed within 7 days following the event.
- f) Maximum of 6 banners are erected in association with the event at separate locations including the venue.
- g) The banner should not be attached to a tree.
