Hornsby Shire Council was awarded the 2014 NSW Coastal Management Award for their "Hawkesbury Watch" website. This website is an innovative tool which provides daily information on swimming conditions, estuarine health grades and real time water quality data.

2014 OEH Estuary Grants Announced

Hornsby Council has been advised by the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage that it has been awarded \$74,000 for estuary projects. The project breakdown is:

- \$24,000 Rehabilitation and management of riparian zones in Lower Hawkesbury Estuary
- \$50,000 Estuarine health monitoring of Hawkesbury's waterways

Additional grants:

- 2014 Habitat Action Grant submitted: One Tree Reach Wetland Remediation Work Stage 3 (\$35.5K including \$10k cash contribution). Currently awaiting for announcement.
- Recreational Fishing Trust grant being considered to address some recreational fishing projects. The potential topics were discussed with the committee include
 - o Fish stock assessment to quantify Carp intrusions
 - Hawkesbury phone app to include fishing grounds, seagrass beds/shallow areas, fishing assets and water quality monitoring sites (probe)
 - o Kayak launching ramp at Crosslands
 - o Fish cleaning tables

Seagrass Education Campaign

- Free community talk on seagrasses and sustainable seafood at @ Hornsby Library by Central Coast Marine Discovery Centre & Greater Sydney LLS with 29 participants

Pacific Oyster Mortality Syndrome

Start of the disease window of infection – 18 Nov 2014. A FRDC funding application has been submitted in May 2014 to progress research on the disease.

Foreshore Clean Up

Activity Report Summary (Aug-Nov 2014) includes;

- 11 trips in the Hawkesbury area
- 2.5 tonnes of rubbish removed
- 5 small derelict boats and old oyster shed

Hornsby Shire Council, CEN, Greater Sydney LLS, Gosford City Council and MacMasters Beach SLSC are meeting to discuss continuation of project.

Social and Economic Evaluation of NSW Coastal Commercial Wild-Catch Fisheries

Project has commenced by researchers from UTS (Dr Kate Barclay). Project details include:

- Fisheries Research & Development Corporation funds
- Half way through 1st round of field interviews 60 commercial fishermen and stakeholders from the Hawkesbury to the Clarence
- Hornsby Shire Council member of Steering Committee:
- First teleconference Monday 24th Nov
- Invitation to meet with Members of the Ministerial Fisheries Advisory Council

Kangaroo Point Pump Out

- Seasonal usage with higher summer readings noted
- Last 2 months higher readings than in previous year
- Pump-out out of service during 2 days

Water Quality Probes

No major issues with probes except for mooring problems at Bar Island after a period of strong winds. Interesting stratification observed after a couple of cold nights and extreme high day temperatures at Berowra Waters probe.

5th and final version of signs has been developed. Construction should commence shortly. Thanks to all those involved.

8. GENERAL BUSINESS

- Peat Island update
- Mayor's Christmas Reception 11th December Café Sorrento (6-8pm)
- Estuary program achievements in 2014

Peter Coad gave an overview of 2014 and our achievements in 2014;

- o Projects to a value of \$135K were implemented in 2013-14
- o \$78K, NSW State Government (Erosion Study & Seagrass)
- o \$30K, Greater Sydney LLS (vegetation assessment of 14 estuarine sites)
- o \$27K, HSC's Catchment Remediation program and Waste program (Clean4Shore)
- o Outcomes include

- 11.2 tonnes of waste removed from the estuarine foreshore by 380 volunteers from the Clean4Shore and Floating Landcare program
- Almost 2000hrs were invested in bush rehabilitation work targeting 25ha of coastal native vegetation and 11.4ha of terrestrial native vegetation. This work was undertaken by Council staff, contractors and Floating Landcare
- Vegetation condition assessments were undertaken at 14 estuarine reserves in the Lower Hawkesbury
- 29km of riverbank was assessed for erosion resilience resulting in immediate management action being required for only 1% of the stretch in the study area
- 16.3ha of seagrass beds have been protected by refurbishing 12 aqua buoys and by relocating 2 cardinal markers
- An education campaign was launched at which 1000 brochures and 1300 stickers were disseminated to raise seagrass awareness
- Ongoing maintenance of 6 water quality probes including additional probe deployed at the entrance to Mullet Creek to assist with research efforts on the Pacific Oyster Mortality Syndrome in support of the local oyster industry
- HawkesburyWatch tools freely available: algal bloom monitoring, swimming conditions, estuarine health levels and real-time water quality data
- 53 onsite wastewater system were inspected and 204,300L of effluent was collected via Council's boat pump-out at Kangaroo Point
