





Other survivors from the earlier garden include mature specimens of *Araucaria heterophylla* (Norfolk Island Pine), *Brachychiton acerifolius* (Illawarra Flame Tree), *Magnolia grandiflora* (Bull Bay), *Lagerstroemia indica* (Crepe Myrtle), *Macadamia tetraphylla* (Australian Nut), *Camellia japonica* cultivars. The house has been replaced by Uniting Care Bowden Brae Gardens, a complex of rendered masonry retirement units with steel picket fence to Frith Avenue boundary with *Viburnum tinus* (Laurustinus) hedge on the outside. The Pennant Hills Road frontage has a brick wall topped with a fence of capped tongue and groove weatherboards, with a timber sound-reduction screen behind. Outside the sound wall are plantings of *Acacia* sp., *Plumbago auriculata*, *Murraya paniculata*, *Camellia japonica*, *Callistemon* sp. and *Melaleuca quinquenervia*.



A fine Inter-war single-storey brick house with terracotta tiled roof and elaborate chimneys, which is largely screened from view by the large front garden. Inter-war Old English style of architecture featuring picturesque asymmetry with projecting bays. A porte cochère on the northern side leads through to the garage at the rear along a crazy paving sandstone driveway which has been expertly repaired.
