6. PRESENTATION

Dr Melanie Bishop - Ecological impacts of QX oyster disease and its strategies of management.

- Summary of findings of research by PhD candidate Emma Wilkie
 - 1. In the Hawkesbury, low QX-mortality of wild Sydney rock oyster, and Pacific oyster abundances remain low
 - 2. In an estuary where reproductive Pacific oysters have been farmed for many years, no evidence of increase in feral Pacifics

- 3. Sydney rock and Pacific oysters appear to play a very similar ecological role in SE Australian estuaries
- Discussion held regarding:
 - · Research methodology and site selection
 - The use of past data from Port Stephens
 - QX prevalence in wild stock compared to farmed stock
 - Differences in tolerance to environmental stressors between Sydney rock and Pacific oysters
 - Future of farming QX resistant Sydney rock oysters

7. PROGRESS REPORT ON THE LOWER HAWKESBURY ESTUARY MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Peter Coad – Hornsby Shire Council

Courangra Point probe redeployed

- Deployed Wednesday 21st March
- Notice put at Spencer local shop outlining the purpose of the buoys
- Not deployed in time to monitor the first Warragamba dam release

Probe data

- Freshwater from the Warragamba dam release was evident at the Gunyah Point probe within a day of the dam opening.
- Committee observation during the flood period:
 - Wendy **McMurdo** obvious changes in water from heavy tannin stain to milky coffee colour.
 - Harry **Recher** the water colour indicates the rubbish coming from upstream.
 - John Stubbs All Broken Bay Oysters stock had been moved from Kimmerikong, Coba and Marramarra down to Porto and Mullet. No stock has been sold from the upper river since November 2011.
 - Harry Recher give consideration to these weather patterns not being isolated incidents.
 - Mary Howard trawlers that have been working for over 10 years know to wait out a high rainfall event. Trawlers can predict severe rain events as prawns disappear and this also indicates when the dams discharge. Large prawns leave the estuary and small prawns dig in to the sediments. There has been evidence of red spot on bream at the mouth of Berowra. In the 2007 flood events there were large quantities of bream with red spot. Bass are being found as low down the river as Laughtondale. Prior to the 2007 fresh over 15 trawlers were working above Windsor, some are now working down towards Berowra.
 - Darryl Lennox Maritime is dealing with incidents right up to Yarramundi, with water still flowing at approximately 15 knots. The Nepean is around a meter higher than usual.
 - Harry **Recher** wood and large logs are an important habitat component of the Hawkesbury and should possibly be left for natural processes.

Real time temperature, salinity and swimming mapping

- Interactive site operational
- Explanatory text being written
- Access to data from probes, rainfall and tide guage

Climate Change Impacts on Estuarine Habitats

- Four different habitats assessed seagrass, mangrove, saltmarsh and floodplain forest
- 2030 and 2050 scenarios considered
- Greatest change in inundation, depth, temperature and salinity at Brooklyn Oval, Cowan Creek, Pumpkin Creek, Propran Creek, Gentlemans Halt, Crosslands, Calna and Mullet Creek
- Each habitat had differing levels of risk being based on their exposure, sensitivity and adaptive capacity
- Recommendations:
 - · more surface elevation data required
 - feasibility study for expansion of mangrove and saltmarsh habitats at sites for example One Tree Reach and Courangra
 - detailed study on seagrasses and the effects of current human stressors, particularly at Dangar Island

Kangaroo Point Pumpout Facility

- 606 263L pumped out since 2008
- 54 720L pumped out for this year
- Monday 12th March 10am 2pm fault with communications. Unable to acknowledge low flow alert (1 day outage)
- 5th January hose broken under ramp (no outage)
- 30th January reduced suction from water in pump (2 days outage)

Oyster Lease Clean-up

3 leases around Bar Island complete

Estuarine and migratory bird survey

- Field surveys to be undertaken by Peter and Judy Smith
- Includes low lying areas and more habitat mapping
- Will be going to mostly new sites

World Migratory Bird Day

- May 12th and 13th 2012
- 2012 theme is *Migratory Birds and People Together Through Time*
- Potentially a walk and talk with representatives from the local Aboriginal community

Warren Brown - Gosford City Council

- A review of wetland management is being undertaken by Gosford Council
- The 1990 Wetland Management Plan is being reviewed and extended from just Brisbane Water to include whole local government area

- All land tenures are to be included in the review
- Wetlands are to be grouped by type
- There is a significant amount of wetland under private ownership which poses management issues

<u>Water quality monitoring for public health</u>. Mike Fish asked if there is any monitoring of water quality around boat ramps and other recreational sites following the recent floods. Discussion was held regarding the difficulties in administering this.

<u>Derelict Boats.</u> Wendy **McMurdo** asked if any action had being taken in relation to two derelict boats in Brooklyn Harbour. Darryl **Lennox** noted that if a vessel is on a commercial mooring there is a commercial issue between the marina and the owner. Maritime will not remove a secured vessel if it is not a navigational or pollution hazard. Maritime is in negotiation with the marina operators and there is action being taken to manage the vessels.

<u>Aboriginal carvings in Marramarra National Park</u>. Mary **Howard** asked if there is any action being taken to preserve these carvings. National Parks manage indigenous artwork.

Peter **Coad** to liaise with National Parks regarding the management of local Aboriginal artwork sites.

ACTION 201204: The Team Leader Estuary Management to request information from National Parks regarding the management of local Aboriginal artwork.
