LOCAL PRIORITIES STATEMENT
2018**

The community service priorities identified in this document for Category 1 assistance for the Hornsby ClubGRANTS Local Committee have been drawn from:

- Hornsby Shire Council Social Plan 2010-2014 and associated Work Plan
- Input from representatives of the Department of Family and Community Services and Council for Social Services NSW .
- Local knowledge of representatives of participating Clubs.

The priorities reflect the needs of a broad range of community groups and service organisations. The objective is to provide the ClubGRANTS Committee with sufficient information on the diverse needs and characteristics of the community to support informed funding advice. It should be noted that the ClubGRANTS guidelines, section 2.1, specify that Category 1 expenditure “is for projects and/or services that contribute to the welfare and broader social fabric of the local community, and are aimed at improving the living standards of low income and disadvantaged people.

Funding should be directed to the local community residing and operating in the Hornsby Local Government Area. Consideration may be given to requests from organisations located outside the area, provided they supply evidence of filling gaps in services in the Hornsby LGA and their services are accessed by Hornsby Shire residents
