Become a volunteer for Floating Landcare and help us protect and restore the Hawkesbury estuary - it's an environmental adventure with a twist!

Who we are

Floating Landcare is organised by the Greater Sydney Local Land Services, funded by the NSW Environmental Trust and run in partnership with Pittwater Council, Hornsby Council, Gosford Council and National Parks and Wildlife Service.

Volunteers from all walks of life and with a range of interests are encouraged to be a part of Floating Landcare.

Floating Landcare is ideally suited to:

- people who enjoy hobbies such as gardening, bushwalking, boating, photography or watching wildlife
- experienced Bushcare and Landcare volunteers keen to improve the environment of a new area
- volunteers from other environmental organisations like plant societies, field naturalists, Streamwatch and Waterwatch
- students and environmental professionals particularly bush regenerators, scientists and educators
- corporate volunteers.

What we do

Volunteers visit locations along the Hawkesbury River and in the Pittwater that are in need of environmental restoration. Activities include bush regeneration to tackle weed hotspots in otherwise pristine bushland. Some locations also require litter collection, planting and some simple flora and fauna surveys.

How do I get involved?

Floating Landcare activities are FREE, and are half a day in duration. Boat travel is included and morning tea and/or lunch is provided, as well as tools and advice from professionals.

RSVP is essential for all activities, as places are limited to 15-20 volunteers at each location.

Adventure Landcare is fun, challenging and takes place in wild places. It delivers important conservation outcomes that could not be done by conventional paid staff because it is too expensive or logistically impossible.

- Conservation kayaking in Sydney Harbour
- Tree planting in the Capertee Valley
- Bush regeneration at locations such as Jenolan Caves
