REFERRAL OF TRAFFIC MATTER FOR COMMENT OR OBJECTION, IF ANY

SUMMARY

This report details the traffic and parking implications for the proposed pedestrian refuge island in Old Beecroft Road in Cheltenham. The facility is being provided in conjunction with Council's Road Reconstruction Program for Old Beecroft Road.

SUBJECT

As part of Council's road reconstruction program of Old Beecroft Road, Council is improving the safety in the area by installing a standard Pedestrian Refuge Island in accordance with RMS Technical Direction TDT2011/01. The Pedestrian Refuge will assist pedestrians to cross Old Beecroft Road in two stages. Parking will be restricted around the Pedestrian Refuge to maintain clear sight lines for pedestrians.

Key features of the proposal are:

- 1. Reduce the crossing distance along Old Beecroft Road near the intersection with Beecroft Road, Cheltenham.
- 2. Provide staged road crossing facility.
- 3. Define / control turning movements at intersection.
- 4. Installation of Pedestrian Refuge in accordance with RMS Technical Direction TDT2011/01.
- 5. Installation of 'No Stopping' restrictions to maintain adequate sight lines.
- 6. Installation of warning signs and delineation of roadway.
- 7. Limiting access of properties near the refuge to 'Left in and Left out'

Plans of the proposed pedestrian refuge is attached.

CONSULTATION

Public consultation was untaken by Council's Design and Construction Branch in conjunction with the proposed road reconstruction of Old Beecroft Road (From Beecroft Road to No 26 Old Beecroft Road). Letters to affected residents were sent on 15 July 2020. Also, the drawings have been on display at the foyer and online. While Council has received telephone inquiries from five residents, none of the issues raised were related to the pedestrian refuge island and associated line marking and signs. Ausgrid was contacted regarding works near kiosk and has agreed with the proposed works.

CONCLUSION

Provision of the pedestrian refuge island at this location will improve safety of pedestrians and encourage walking trips. It will also formalise vehicle turning movements at the intersection.

RECOMMENDATION THAT

 Construction of Pedestrian Refuge and associated regulatory and warning signs in Old Beecroft Road at the intersection with Beecroft Road, Cheltenham be approved in accordance with plan No 100188

2. The street lighting at the pedestrian refuge be viewed and upgraded if warranted.
