Achievements

- Bushcare and Community celebrate 22 years of the volunteer bushcare program with 800 volunteers restoring 71 hectares at 123 different sites.
- Community Nursery increased production by 20% and propagated upwards of 50,000 native plants for use in our reserves and community programs.
- Habitat ongoing restoration of the One Tree Reach wetland at Laughtondale, providing a habitat for five endangered vegetation communities and wetland fauna. Funding received for a boardwalk.
- Bar Island new jetty operational improving access and three Keep Australia Beautiful Clean Beach Awards received.
- Hornsby Heritage Depression era steps completed following significant restoration work.
- Free guided bushwalks program over 400 people attended 35 free guided bushwalks during the year.
- Rural Lands Incentives Program 250 people attended six workshops and 166 property owners restored 51,000m² of bushland including endangered ecological communities.
- Bushfire completed 2011-2016 Manual Hazard Reduction and Fire Trail Maintenance Program.
- Parsley Bay Rain Gardens, Brooklyn completed construction of four new 'rain garden' bio-filters. Designed to filter pollutants, sediment and oil from stormwater running off the surface of the Parsley Bay car park.
- Stormwater quality improvement devices completed construction of six new devices at Mt Colah, North Epping, Hornsby, Hornsby Heights and Cherrybrook.
- Removing Pollutants from Local Waterways more than 1,100 tonnes of waste captured by 423 stormwater quality improvement devices which filter and treat polluted stormwater before it ends up in our waterways.

- Estuary Management Program ongoing actions and initiatives to improve and clean up the Hawkesbury River.
- Water Quality continuing to monitor the water quality of our creeks and estuaries and provide real time temperature, salinity and chlorophyll information. Successful lobbying to stop Sydney Water from increasing the nutrients discharged from the Brooklyn Sewage Treatment Plant.
- Waste reduction workshops approximately 560 residents attended events including bus tours, hands-on workshops covering a range of topics including composting, eco gardening and keeping chooks in your backyard.
- Ready Set Grow schools program 20 schools creating sustainable veggie gardens. 32 school visits assisting with reducing waste, composting education and creating veggie patches
- Returned to Glory Recycled Art Competition and Exhibition 53 artworks entered celebrating the reuse and recycling of waste through art.
- Recycling 54% of all waste materials collected (equating to 35,418 tonnes) was recycled. 130 tonnes of old computers, TVs and accessories have been dropped off at Council's Thornleigh Depot, to be recycled. The long awaited federally funded industry recycling scheme will take over this service as of 1 July 2012.
- Illegal dumping 291 lots of dumped rubbish has been recovered, including 96 mattresses and 80 tonnes of wood mulch, resulting in three fines issued and a cost to Council of thousands of dollars to recover.

Achievements

- Wallarobba Arts and Cultural Centre opened in late 2011. The centre has held 16 exhibitions, offers two free open studio sessions each week as well as other weekly classes and is a permanent home for the Hornsby Arts Society.
- Healthy Living Festival featured 235 events by partnering with local services, promoting a healthy lifestyle from guided bushwalks to cooking classes for seniors.
- Festival of the Arts showcased the Shire's creative community producing almost 300 events, with 250 works on show for the Hornsby Art Prize.
- 'Rock (and Vox) the Block 4' young performers from across the Shire took centre stage for this popular competition.
- Children's Voices for Reconciliation 10 schools participated and 200 people attended.
- Digital Photo Competition received over 600 entrants, with voting online for the first time.
- 736 new citizens have been granted Australian Citizenship at Citizenship Ceremonies.
- Mobile website launched improving the way we communicate and providing wifi access in the Council Chambers.
- Council website received 700,000 visits in the last year, the mobile site has over 63,000 users, 1,200 twitter followers and 5,000 people receive the monthly enewsletter.
- Home modification and maintenance service delivered to over 700 clients, providing services for frail aged, people with a disability and their carers.
- 'Be Safe Be Prepared' project delivered seven workshops to inform the community of internet safety, safety at home and in the neighbourhood and scams.
- Settlement Services Program helps new migrants to settle and adjust to their new life in Australia.
 A multicultural soccer match with people from Spain, Iran, China and Korea attracted 400 people.

- Local partnerships help Council to deliver a range of healthy lifestyle activities such as Tai Chi, Heart Moves, Line Dancing, Skateboarding workshops, seminars about dementia, hearing and vision, through to promoting mental health.
- Council's Donations Program helps over 30 local organisations to address social and community issues through the provision of small grants.
- Aboriginal Programs aimed at supporting Aboriginal community members through education, aged care, home and community care, family support, events and activities. This includes the successful launch of the "Our Kids, "Our Mob" project. Providing social and cultural support to non Aboriginal families that provide care for Aboriginal children.
- New regulations for child care centres have resulted in staff at all four of Council's child care centres being trained to a minimum Certificate 3.
- Community Centre and Child Care Facility at Storey Park, Asquith proposed and under review.
- NSW Local Government Week Award for "Most Innovative Youth Week Program" presented to Hornsby Shire Council in recognition of Youth Week 2011.
- Hornsby Shire Council's libraries welcome 1 million visitors per year, have 70,000 members and lent over 1.2 million items.
- Over 10,000 children attended 300 story-time sessions during the year.
- Hosted two Sydney Writer Festival events with over 300 attendees at Hornsby Library.
- Over 100,000 computer bookings with 89 people attending one on one training sessions.
- Over 300 audio and ebooks downloaded since being launched in May 2012.

- 2 Fees and charges includes fees from Development Applications and revenue earned from aquatic centres, nurseries and preschools, commercial waste services, park and oval hire and property rentals.
- 3 Interest investment income received from Council's investment portfolio, overdue rates and annual charges interest.
- 4 Grants and contributions includes development contributions, the Federal Government's Financial Assistance Grant and numerous smaller amounts from governments for services including preschools, bushfire mitigation, children's services, various community services, libraries, roads, various environmental grants and pensioner rate subsidy.

- 4 Internal costs and depreciation internal costs are initially recorded as various operating costs and subsequently recharged elsewhere as operating or capital expenditure in order to determine the full cost.
- Materials and contracts includes all costs, other than employee costs, associated with the maintenance of parks, roads, buildings, nurseries and preschools, aquatic centres, drainage and the cost of waste services. Also included are environmental protection and plant operating expenditure.
