REFERRAL OF TRAFFIC MATTER FOR COMMENT OR OBJECTION, IF ANY

SUMMARY

This report details the traffic implications of Proposed Pedestrian Refuge in Malton Road, North Epping, near the intersection with Norfolk Road, to improve pedestrian safety.

SUBJECT

Council is considering constructing a pedestrian refuge in Malton Road near Norfolk Road to improve pedestrian safety at this location. The pedestrian refuge will allow pedestrians to cross the road in two stages, reducing their exposure to traffic. The refuge will also reduce the speed of traffic near the intersection.

Council has adopted a 'walking and cycling' strategy which identifies the need to provide a shared path along Norfolk Road between Boundary Road and Somerset Street. The refuge islands and kerb ramps will enhance safety of cyclists in the future once the shared path is provided.

Key features of the proposal are:

- 1. Installation of two concrete islands in Malton Road to form a pedestrian refuge.
- 2. Reconstruction of adjoining path and kerb ramps at the intersection suitable for future connection to a shared path.
- 3. Installation of 'No Stopping' restrictions to ensure visibility between pedestrians and vehicles at the intersection. Note that approximately 4 parking spaces will be removed.
- 4. Installation of warning signs and delineation of roadway.
- 5. Installation of 'Bus Zone' signs in Norfolk Road to at an existing bus stop near Malton Road.
- 6. Relocation of Australia Post mailing box and installation of 'Mail Zone' signs in Malton Road.

A plan of the Proposed Pedestrian Refuge is attached.

CONSULTATION

In June 2023, Council invited comments on the proposal from residents and occupiers. The proposal was also placed on exhibition on Council's website for 14 days. Fifteen (15) letters were sent to nearby residents, occupiers and schools, as well as eight (8) notifications to regulatory authorities and transport providers. Additional consultation was undertaken with Busways and Australia Post in July 2023 in relation to additional Mail Zone and Bus Zone signs near the intersection.

Fourteen (14) written responses were received. Thirteen (13) providing general support and offering other suggestions. One (1) objection. A *Public Consultation Summary* of the submissions and Council responses is attached to this report. Copies of submissions are available upon request.

The submissions from community groups, residents and service providers have been addressed in the attached consultation summary report resulting in a number of amendments to the original proposal. The main changes are additional 'No Stopping' restrictions on all legs of the intersection and formalising the Give Way signage and delineation at the intersection as well as formalising the bus stop with 'Bus Zone' signs in Norfolk Road, relocation of post box and new 'Mail Zone' in Malton Road.
