



Activity Background	 Bushcare is a program where community volunteers work with Council to undertake bush regeneration activities, as a group, in Bushland Reserves across Hornsby Shire and under the supervision of an appointed Council officer (Bushcare site supervisor). Volunteers meet according to an agreed schedule, usually once a month and generally for a 3-hour work session. Site plans are developed by the Bushcare site supervisor in consultation with volunteers. Site plans include a map with work zones, desired outcomes, prioritised actions, risk assessment, emergency contact numbers and an emergency evacuation plan.
General Requirements	Volunteers are required to: Observe requirements outlined in the Bushcode and the directions of their appointed Bushcare site supervisor. Report all hazards/incidents to your Bushcare site supervisor or directly to SafeHold on 9847 4848. Advise your Bushcare site supervisor if you have a medical condition that may affect your ability to perform the physical requirements of Bushcare. Observe requirements of Council's Alcohol and other Drugs Policies. Undertake site risk assessment with Bushcare site supervisor prior to each work session.
First Aid and Emergency Management	 Follow the directions of your Bushcare site supervisor. Refer on-site emergencies to your Bushcare site supervisor. Contact the emergency services where required (call 000). Council-trained First Aider will be present during all volunteer works. Council-supplied First Aid kit will be on site with the Bushcare site supervisor during each work session. First Aid supplies include tick and leech management equipment and compression bandage for snake/spider bites.
Personal Protective Equipment	Council supplies: Sun protection (broad brimmed hat, long sleeved shirt and sunscreen). Insect repellent. P1 respirator for use as required. Gloves for all weeding and planting, composting activities. Volunteers to wear enclosed footwear.
Plant, Equipment and substances	Volunteers are supplied with: Tool belt with knife and secateurs. Short hand-held saw. Loppers. Weed bags. Glyphosate in 125ml applicator (volunteer use of herbicide is optional).

Hazards	Recommended Controls		
Faulty/damaged or poorly maintained equipment	 Use appropriate tools for the job you are undertaking. Report faulty or broken equipment to your Bushcare site supervisor for removal from use. 		
Slips, Trips & Falls	 Work within designated worksite/site plan area and as directed by the Bushcare site supervisor. Ensure that traffic areas are free from obstacles. 		





Hazards	Recommended Controls
Manual Handling	 Workers to undertake warm up of muscles and joints prior to commencing activity. Workers to change activity and posture on a frequent basis – approximately every 20 minutes. Restrict amount of vegetation placed in supplied hessian bags/buckets to < 4kg. For woody weeds, cut at base and paint poison on the stump rather than pulling them out. Request assistance in moving vegetation, etc. as required.
Sustained Postures Repetitive activities	 Rotate activities regularly. Alternate working postures where possible between sitting, kneeling, squatting and standing.
Ticks, leeches, spiders, snakes, ants	 Wear enclosed shoes, long sleeve shirt/pants with socks over pants. Apply insect repellent to clothing/shoes. Report any bites or stings to your Bushcare site supervisor or directly to SafeHold on 9847 4848.
Biological and Allergens: Soil microbes (tetanus) Legionnaires Spores Plant material	 Notify your Bushcare site supervisor if you are aware of allergies to specific plants, etc. Keep skin covered – long sleeve shirt/pants. Wear gloves for weeding, planting and composting. Wash hands after handling weeds, soil, compost, pots, and chemicals especially before eating, drinking or smoking. Be aware of tetanus vaccination status. Keep immunity current. Seek medical attention for cuts/lacerations if unsure of tetanus immunity status.
Chemical exposure - Roundup (glyphosate)	 Roundup (glyphosate) use is restricted to a 125ml applicator bottle and only to be used under the direction of your Bushcare site supervisor. No spraying of chemicals by volunteers or use of other herbicides/chemicals. Wear supplied chemical resistant gloves (Alphatec 58-270) when applying Roundup.
Lone or remote work	 No working on Bushcare sites alone. No working on Bushcare sites outside of scheduled work program. Volunteers to sign on at beginning of session and sign off at conclusion.
Cuts to fingers and hands from sharp cutting tools	 No use of power tools/machinery while working at Bushcare site. Wear supplied gloves for Bushcare activities. Hold plant material above or below cutting area and work carefully and steadily. Store secateurs in pouch when not in use. Knife to be sheathed when not in use. Use well maintained tools. Use correct tool for the task. Report ALL injuries to your Bushcare site supervisor or to SafeHold by calling 9847 4848.
