# Survey undertaken March/April 2025

## We Care - But There's a Gap Between Caring and Doing

- 88% of you feel personally responsible for protecting the local creek a powerful sign of community care.
- But only 1 in 4 are ready to take action. Imagine the impact if everyone did just one creek-friendly thing!

#### Many Don't Know We Live at the Source

- Nearly 75% of respondents didn't know our local waterway is called Berowra Creek.
- Our Walumeda Catchment, stretching from Thompsons Corner to Boundary Road, forms the headwaters of the Berowra Creek Catchment what happens here flows downstream to the Hawkesbury River estuary.

## Pollution is Visible — But Not Always Understood

- Almost 50% of locals have seen pollution such as litter, garden waste, or building site runoff impacting the creek.
- 12% of people weren't sure what stormwater pollution is a clear sign we need to raise awareness about how everyday activities affect our creeks.

#### We Visit — But Barriers Remain

- 60% of you visit the creek at least monthly enjoying bush tracks, the duck pond, and New Farm Rd bushland.
- But access, safety, pests, and water quality are common reasons people don't visit more often.

#### What's Stopping Action?

The top barriers to protecting the creek:

- Lack of time
- Unclear guidance on what to do
- Issues with accessing the creek including health or mobility limitations
