# **North Epping Fitness Trail**

#### 1. Background

The aim of the North Epping Fitness Trail project is to provide improved community access to regional open space with new pedestrian footpaths connecting Nort Epping Oval to Lane Cove National Park. The project will be delivered in Two (2) Stages due to availability of funding.

Stage one proposed works include:

- Concrete pedestrian footpath around north and east side of North Epping Oval.
- Footpath to Woodridge Ave, part Malton Road connecting oval path to Lane Cove National Park
- Footpath to part Beck St, part Downes Street connecting oval path to Lane Cove National Park
- Fitness station with couple of outdoor exercise equipment North side of the Oval along the trail.

Funding for the first stage works is from Council's 7.12 contributions plan and a \$150,000 - NSW Government Metropolitan Greenspace Program grant.

Stage two works for an extension to paths near amenities building and additional fitness station is subject to future funding.

The community were invited to review a Landscape Plan and provide their feedback.

#### 3. Respondents

A total of 45 submissions were received.

- 23 people completed the online survey
- 22 comments were received via email or letters

#### 4. Consultation Feedback

The following was the broad categorisation of the respondent preferences:

- 10 submissions supported the proposal with some requested for additional works in the area.
- 3 submissions were opposed to pathway works in the area.
- 19 submissions provided a petition letter opposing the pathway along Woodridge
   Avenue/Malton Road, but supporting the pathway and outdoor fitness equipment in Stage 1
   and proposing to complete Stage 2 pathway around the Oval in lieu of the proposed street
   pathways.

- 3 submissions supported the proposal but requested the fitness equipment to be moved away from the residential houses.
- 3 submissions opposed the pathway works on Downes Street.
- Other comments discussed various issues such as storm water drainage, required upgrade to the club building and requirement of additional facilities that are beyond the scope of this project.

#### 5. Consultation Results

Based on the community consultation results received, the following changes are incorporated in the North Epping Fitness Trail proposal.

- Project Grant funding was provided by Department of Planning, Housing and infrastructure (DPHI) to provide a sealed pedestrian link to Lane Cove National Park and create a fitness trail. Based on community response DPHI accepted that a the circuit could still be achieved via a walking route along Woodridge Avene without the need for a sealed footpath due to the wide verge. As a result Council will remove the concrete footpath from along Woodridge Avenue and part Malton Road. DPHI also agreed that any funds allocated to Woodridge Ave footpath could be redirected to a footpath along the south of Beck Street to meet the existing pathway along Boundary Road.
- The fitness equipment has been moved further away from resident houses and closer to the oval.

A sealed footpath was retained along the northern side of Downes Street to complete the footpath network along the Southern side of this road. It was also retained to ensure a safe off road connection to the National Park as the road and verge in this area are narrow.
