

CROP ROTATION FOR YOUR VEGIE PATCH

Crop Rotation is a great way to manage your patch. The age old method reduces the likelihood of pests and diseases and improves productivity. A yearly rotation schedule would look something like this:

	BED 1	BED 2	BED 3	BED 4
YEAR 1	Brassicas and leafy vegetables Cabbage, pak choi, silverbeet etc.	Other – Rooting and fruiting crops Tomatoes, potatoes, carrots, celery	Alliums Onions, leeks, garlic, chives	Legumes Peas, beans, broad beans, Other - Okra
