Good fast growing shade tree for coastal situations. A straight, upright tree with rough, fibrous bark on all branches. The long irregular branches spread laterally, and form a dense canopy with the broad green leaves

Height and width in Cultivation

Domed canopy 16m (h) x 7m (w) branching lateral to upward; foliage concentrated at ends of branches.

Street trees

Suitable for areas where there are no overhead services

Trunk

Grows commonly as a straight upright tree with a single trunk

Bark

Bark is reddish-brown and stringy in appearance.

Green on the upper and lower surface and cluster towards the end of branches

Flowers

White flowers in April - September
